**Eligible Players**

(i) Players registered to play with a Club's Reserve Grade team (being a Player who has not played more than 5 first team matches, in the last three years, in a Tier 1 to 2 Competition)

(ii) Players registered to a Tier 2 Club on a part time contract

(iii) Academy Players.

In the first instance, a Player may only be Community Game Dual Registered to his Club of Origin (being the last Community Club that the Player has previously played for).

Before a Player can play as a Community Game Dual Registered Player:

- (i) a Community Game Dual Registration form must have been signed by the Professional Club, the Community Club and the Player;
- (ii) such form must have been submitted to the RFL ([Peter.Stephenson@rfl.co.uk](mailto:Peter.Stephenson@rfl.co.uk)) no later than noon on the Thursday prior to the Match:
- (iii) an acknowledgement must have been received from the RFL that such Community Game Dual Registration has been registered.
